PASTOR'S REPORT

I'd like to recognize the work of our elders for demonstrating their leadership after I announced my intention to retire in January. The work of the monthly meetings of the Session launched Project Regeneration in order to complete a Mission Study to begin the process to search for a new pastor. This Study is required by the Presbytery before naming a Pastor Nominating Committee. The Session elders and the Nominating Committee worked all spring and summer to prayerfully nominate the following eleven people to be presented and voted on by the Congregation in September. Your elders, leaders and staff provide faithful leadership for us to lead joyous worship, which is livestreamed to our friends at home, and others who cannot join us in person. I want to thank our Deacons who lovingly connect and offer care to the people. The Deacons offer care with their phone calls, cards, emails and texts as needed. Additionally, the Deacons serve the members of the congregation each week during the fellowship hour and with receptions for members for memorial services. Additionally, our Board of Deacons continues to collect food monthly and provide funds to the three local food closets.

All our leadership meetings for Elders and Deacons are conducted in hybrid matter, both in-person and hosted on the Zoom platform. Our church musicians have continued to prepare stimulating and faithful music every Sunday. I am grateful for those who led all of the small groups and Bible studies offered on regular basis. One of my favorite activities of the year is when our Lenten small groups meet. The conversations and connections spiritually prepare us for the Easter Celebration.

Our Winter Sanctuary volunteers oversaw a week-long overnight stay in Runquist Hall for the men and upstairs in the C.E. building for the women. There is always a delicious homemade dinner and enough food to take with them for the following morning. Several of our volunteers continue to provide leadership for the Citrus Heights HART (Homeless Action Resource Team) program. The men and women of the Overthe-Hill Gang continue to meet weekly and put in many hours to maintain our facility and work on special projects on the property. All enjoy the Trunk or Treat with jump houses and carefully decorated trunks the Sunday before Halloween. We counted more than 300 kids, youth and adults who visited our campus, most in full costume.

Thank you for your generous and faithful response to financially support our ministry in 2023! With the Session elders, I rejoice that we were able to provide all the weekly activities and special events that help our people proclaim the message of the Risen Christ. As you read the following pages of our report, you discover the life and ministry of Celtic Cross Presbyterian Church. As your pastor, I continue to be grateful and experience great joy for the way God is working in all our lives.

<u>Minutes</u> of all regular and special meetings of Session, as well as the Congregational Meetings, were recorded and approved.

Session held 11 regular meetings in 2023.

<u>Congregational Meetings</u>: The Annual Congregational and Corporation Meetings were held on January 29, 2023. Special Congregational Meetings were held on September 24, to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee and December 17, 2023, to elect Elders and Deacons.

Attendance: Average in-person attendance has been 49 in the Traditional Service and 36 in the Modern Service with an average of 10 units viewing each of the services live online. Average attendance at the Sunday morning Kids Ministry has been 5.

PERSONNEL & EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Personnel and Executive Committee (P&E) is a committee of Session. P&E normally meets the second Tuesday as required to review personnel matters and items of business that need to be brought to Session.

P&E is made up of three Session team leaders, plus the Treasurer, Senior Pastor, and Clerk of Session. The members serving in 2023 were Mike McKibbin, Stewardship; Mike O'Brien, Operations; and Tracey Wiltshire, Outreach & Membership; Sue Hurd, Treasurer; Alice Sundquist; and Bob Yule (ex officio).

In 2023 we moved approx. \$138,000 from demand accounts at the Synod of the Pacific to Bank of Marin to get a better rate on invested funds and to facilitate transfers into our checking account at Bank of Marin.

There were no staff changes in 2023.

Pastor Yule announced at the January Session meeting that he plans to retire effective as of January 31, 2025. Given the timeline and at Pastor Yule's suggestion, we sought and received Presbytery approval to conduct our Mission Study and pastoral search prior to his retirement date, rather than waiting and then naming an Interim Pastor.

In April the Session approved participation in the Presbyterian Foundation's Project Regeneration process. Project Regeneration helps churches determine their mission focus going forward. This will provide important content for the Session-developed Mission Study, which is the first step of the Pastoral search process.

The Congregation elected a Pastor Nominating Committee at a Special Congregational Meeting on September 24, 2023.

The Personnel Commission, appointed annually by the Session, focuses specifically on personnel issues and provides recommendations to the P&E Committee and Session on personnel matters. During 2023 the Personnel Commission was comprised of Dave Terwilliger, Tracey Wiltshire and William Van Duker, with Rev. Yule as ex officio.



OUTREACH & MEMBERSHIP

Nurturing meaningful connections with the greater community was pursued through multiple avenues in 2023. The Outreach & Growth (O&G) Elder collaborated regularly with the Office Manager to develop social media ads and posts highlighting opportunities available through Celtic Cross. Church members are invited to share their pictures of Celtic Cross happenings for social media posts as well.

To promote the 40 Days of Prayer phase of the churchwide Project Regeneration process, the O&G Elder and the Modern Worship Elder teamed up together to film short video segments featuring 17 people in the Celtic Cross community. These were shown during August and September worship services and were posted on social media.

Several parts of the campus have been refreshed for a more inviting atmosphere. First-time visitors and long-time congregants alike can access the new Connection Corner in the Narthex to check out church programs and events through hard copy handouts with QR codes which link directly to areas of ministry. Posters in the Core, featuring Celtic Cross members engaging in all kinds of activities, were updated and current, seasonal information related to the life of the church is found on the conversation area tables.

The Text CONNECT system remains in place to acquire church information. When "CONNECT" is texted to the church office number, a menu pops up with links about programmatic offerings, worship services and requests for prayer.

Hybrid Mental Wellness Workshops (MWWs) continued to be offered during the past year. These 90-minute workshops, developed and facilitated by Tracey Wiltshire, MSW and Patty Yule, LPCC, delved into various topics:

 Loss, Grief, Hope & Healing
 Holidays When You Hurt

Workshop attendees receive post-workshop emails with follow-up resources, a feedback survey and a mechanism to suggest topics for future workshops. Support from the church's Tech Team and the Office Manager were integral to these events' success. MWWs are advertised on social media, in weekly church e-blasts and the Sunday bulletin (paper and e-versions). A QR code banner is displayed in front of the church the week before each workshop as another advertising lever and Celtic Cross members invite family, friends and neighbors. Workshop registration is done electronically through either QR Code or by texting "MWW" to the church's number. Participants can also register by calling the church office.

We look to continue exploring ways to engage with our surrounding community through Christian care and love.

OPERATIONS

Though it is not meant to fill cracks, it will extend the life of the pavement and at the very least make the parking stalls more noticeable. Missions

With your generosity in 2023 we have supported many crucial Mission needs. Highlighted are some ministries in which we participated this year. The complete list is included. During Winter Sanctuary from January 8th – 14th, we partnered with Citrus Heights HART and provided warm overnight shelter and meals in our church for about twenty unhoused guests. In addition to food, our church contributes monetary donations to these ministries to provide for unmet needs.

Our Mission support extends around the world. In our February 12th worship services, the Welo family were our quests and gave testimony about their Christian missionary work in Indonesia. Through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, we gave a monetary donation to victims of the February earthquakes in Turkey and Syria and to victims of violence in war-torn Israel and Gaza.

This summer our church supported sixteen students at the Sierra College chapter of Intervarsity who completed the Global Trek mission trip in Mexico and Nicaragua. In June our Mission Team provided a send-off event, and on July 17th we provided lunch and dinner during their follow up session to debrief and plan for the 2024 Trek.





In August our church collected school supplies and monetary donations for Coyle Avenue Elementary School located in our neighborhood. The delivery truck was packed to the brim with supplies! In December we gave each school employee a Starbucks gift card to show our appreciation for their service to children.

In October we sent a special donation to the Maui Food Bank to provide for the needs of Lahaina residents who lost their homes and businesses in the deadly August 8th wildfires on Maui. Doreen Owens' grand-daughter Emily lives there and teaches at Maui High School. While Emily did not lose her home, she has students who were displaced by the fires. She advocated for relief aid for these students.

Throughout the year we supported the outreach services of Downtown Ministries with monetary contributions and 25 health kits to needy families. At the request of DTM, our church provided a special offering instead of holiday food baskets for Thanksgiving. Your generous giving enabled DTM to provide for the needs of many homeless families and children in our community.

This is my first year serving as your Mission Elder. I thank each of you for faithfully supporting our Mission activities. I am humbled by your generosity and participation. I pray that the love of Jesus will shine through us as we follow John 15:12, "Love one another as I have loved you," and this love will bring peace in our world.
