Use the Gifts God Has Given YouBy Pastor Bob Yule

The parable of the talents teaches us that the Master gives us different amounts; we don't get to choose our talents! Here is how one servant responded in Matthew 15:24-25 CEV:

"The servant who had been given 1,000 coins then came in and said, 'Sir, I know that you are hard to work for. You harvest what you don't plant and gather crops where you haven't scattered seed. I was frightened and went out and hid your money in the ground. Here is every single coin!"

Our responsibility is to build our lives with the gifts and talents we have been given. The one thing we cannot do is nothing. Do not let fear defeat you, take a step. A recent devotional by Pastor Rick Warren provided this insight of reminders that begin with the letter 'C': We all have (1) Chemistry, (2) Connections, (3) Circumstances, (4) Consciousness and (5), Choices." The last factor, our choices, enables us to overcome the challenges of the first four factors.

We cannot change the way we are wired, the family we were born into, the situation we find ourselves in. "Do not compare your situation with someone else." We are all in different places in life. We were not given the same number of talents, gifts and abilities. We can make choices, which is the only factor within our control.

Let me suggest these choices to guide our life each day:

- 1. I can choose to get healthy (Take a walk).
- 2. I can choose to risk connecting (Volunteer to help someone).
- 3. I can choose to trust God (Daily read God's Word).
- 4. I can choose what I think about (*Talk to God-pray*).
